Content	Articles about conservation projects, which can be short notes or longer;
	reports on visits, conferences etc; book reviews
	Style is fairly informal and articles are not peer-reviewed

Icon Journal

Format	Printed copy published twice a year and distributed to Icon members. At present one issue a year is for all subject areas, and the other one is for book and paper conservation.
Content	Can be fairly long and formal articles, or shorter notices on 'more practical subjects'. Articles and shorter notices are peer-reviewed.
Submission	Submissions can be discussed by contacting the journal editor, Janet Berry (<u>journal@icon.org.uk</u>), and submissions are made through the online submission system. Submission dates are typically around 10 months before the journal is published.

Content	Short news items, which appear to be written by the editor, and longer
	articles on projects, case studies etc.

Studies in Conservation

Format	A bi-monthly journal which combines <i>Studies in Conservation</i> with <i>Reviews in Conservation</i> . All papers published in <i>Studies in Conservation</i> are available on-line free to IIC members from the IIC web-site. Additionally, <i>Studies</i> articles from the year 1980 onwards can also be downloaded without charge by members, and purchased by non-members, from Maney Online. Printed
	copies of Studies are available from <u>Maney Publishing</u> .
Content	There is no minimum or maximum length for an article, although papers of longer than 10,000 words may need to be shorted. Articles tend to be fairly formal, and include review papers. Articles are peer- reviewed.

Conservation Distlist

Format	Electronic newsletter emailed to the distribution list on roughly a weekly
	basis. It is free to be placed on the distribution list.
Content	The Conservation Distlist is mainly used to make conservation enquiries (e.g.
	to ask for suggestions of an appropriate treatment or the name of a
	conservation supplier), or to advertise jobs, internships, training courses etc.
	However, it is also used to report on work in progress, or a change in a
	particular organization, or the creation of a new training course etc.
	Submissions should be under 50 lines (68 characters wide).
	Content is not peer-reviewed and only receives a brief check from the
	moderator of the Distlist.
Submission	Guidance on appropriate submissions is available online.
	Submissions are emailed to consdistlist@cool.conservation-us.org
	You must be a member of the distribution list to post content, unless you are
	posting an advert for a job, internship etc.
	There are no deadlines, and postings are generally put up within a few days.

Journal of Paper Conservation (IADA)

Format	A quarterly printed journal, which is distributed free to members, or can be purchased from the publisher (contact@seidelpublishers.de)
Content	Articles on projects, case studies and treatment developments. Articles tend to be fairly formal, and are peer-reviewed.
Submission	The website has guidelines for authors and instructions on how to write a scientific paper, and articles are submitted through the website.

Journal of Cultural Heritage

Format	Printed copy published every 2 months. Articles are also published electronically and can be downloaded for a fee.
Content	Articles tend to be fairly formal, and are peer-reviewed. Most articles are scientific studies, although case studies are published occasionally. The maximum length of articles is 5000 words for scientific studies and 2000 words for case studies.

Format	Open access electronic journal – printed copies available to buy.
Content	Articles are scientific studies with a heritage theme e.g. analysis of historic

	membership fee. Articles are submitted through the website, which also has
	detailed guidelines for authors.

Format	A monthly magazine, published in print and online.
Content	The sections into which the articles are grouped are News, Comment,
	Features, Reviews and Back of the magazine (which comprises 'The List',
	'People' and 'Best in Show'). Some sections are written by Museums Journal
	staff, others are written by the person who submits the copy. The content is
	biased towards museum management and curating.
Submission	Different sections have different lead times, from 2 weeks prior to
	publication for News, to 3 months prior to publication for Features.

Context (IHBC Journal)

Format	Printed copy is published bi-monthly, and it is free to subscribers.
Content	Contributions range from short news items to longer articles of up to 1500 words. Conference reports and book reviews of up to 500 words are also permitted.
Submission	Notes for authors and book reviewers are available on the website. Unsolicited articles are welcome, but it is advised that the editor is contacted first, <u>editor@ihbc.org.uk</u> . Submission deadlines can be found online – typically articles are published 2 months after the deadline (e.g. an article submitted in March will be published in the May journal).

Papyrus (IAMFA Journal)

Format	Printed copy is published three times a year, and it is distributed free to IAMFA members. Issues which are more than a year old are also available on the IAMFA website.
Content	The style is quite informal, and the length of contributions may vary. Guidance notes can be obtained from the editor. Papyrus is about the construction and management (including environmental control) of heritage buildings.
Submission	Contact details for the editor are available on the website, and submissions should be emailed directly to the editor. Members of IAMFA receive emails reminding them of deadlines. Typically articles are published 1-2 months after the deadline.
